Feature	Example from one of the reviews
A description of the interior of the restaurant at the beginning.	
A description of the various items on the menu and how they chose items from the menu.	
The prices of the food on the menu and the overall price of the whole meal.	
Descriptions of what the food <b>looked</b> like.	
Descriptions of what the food <b>tasted</b> like.	
Personal opinions about the food.	
A summary of the writer's overall feelings of the restaurant.
